THA Partners with the Trenton Health Team to Beat COVID-19



The Trenton Health Team (THT) recently partnered with THA to offer COVID-19 and other vaccinations required for children to attend school. The THT brought their mobile van to Donnelly Homes for six weeks to make the COVID-19 vaccination available to residents in the surrounding community. THA continues to update staff and residents about where they can receive vaccinations, boosters, and COVID-19 tests.

THA also recently partnered with Our Pharmacy to provide COVID-19 tests for four weeks to all residents. The weekly clinics were held in the Abbott Apartments, French Towers, Josephson Apartments, Donnelly Homes Gymnasium, Prospect Village Community Room, and the Wilson Homes Community Room. THA is gearing up to offer all three vaccination and booster shots through a partnership with the NJ Department of Health. Thanks to the recent opening of the City of Trenton Neighborhood Clinic, our residents have a new location where they can receive COVID-19 vaccinations and tests.



Mercer County Community College Offers FREE Certificate Programs

Mercer County Community College (MCCC) is working to break down the barriers preventing residents from enjoying the benefits of continuing education by launching the Community Development Block Grant. The program gives Trenton residents access to more than 50 FREE credential programs. MCCC also covers transportation and childcare costs.
